#### **BY-LAWS**

### The IWLA Cub Run Archers of Centreville, Virginia PREAMBLE

The IWLA Cub Run Archers Club (**CRA**) is authorized by the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter of the Izaak Walton League of America to further the sport of archery and promote and establish facilities for the enjoyment of this sport by the Arlington-Fairfax IWLA membership. These facilities have been constructed so as to be in strict accordance with standards set by the National Field Archery Association (NFAA). Such facilities are located on the property of the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter of IWLA. The Club is a chartered member of both the National Field Archery Association through the Virginia Field Archery Association and the Virginia Bowhunter's Association.

#### ORGANIZATION

A. **GOVERNING BODY.** The Club is to be governed by an elected Executive Board which is to consist of the following nine (9) officers and directors:

- 1. President
- 2. Vice-President
- 3. Secretary
- 4. Treasurer
- 5. Range Captain
- 6. Director of 3-D Archery
- 7. Director of Indoor Archery
- 8. Director of Membership, Youth and Community Relations
- 9. Director of Social Activities

The duties of each office are delineated under the section entitled OPERATION. President will appoint a VBA Representative to attend to the Club's interest at VBA meetings.

B. **MEMBERSHIP PROCEDURES** : Membership in the Club is by application to the Secretary on the appropriate application form and accompanied with the appropriate dues at time of application. New members will be announced at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Club. All members must be current members of the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, IWLA.

#### C. MEMBERSHIP IN AND MEETINGS OF THE CLUB

- 1. Two classes of memberships are available:
- a. Cub Run Associate membership
- b. Cub Run Associate and VBA membership

2. Annual dues shall be in accordance with the current dues structure of CRA and VBA. Dues for Cub Run Associate membership, either single or family, shall be fifteen (15) dollars annually with initial payment upon application.

3. Any member may be expelled from the Club by a majority vote of the members present at any regularly scheduled business meeting of the Club, for conduct detrimental to the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, IWLA, and/or Cub Run Archers. A reapplication for membership must be approved by a two-thirds vote of the membership present. The regular meeting of the Club shall be held at the archery field house on the first Sunday of each month, except as Announced at any regular meeting, at a time of day to be determined by the President. At least four (4) elected members of the Executive Board and four non-elected members of the Club must be present to constitute a quorum.

4. At the regular meeting held in June of each year, the President shall appoint a Nominating Committee composed of two members. This Committee shall post a slate of candidates for the nine (9) positions on the Executive Board in the archery field house by the first of July following. Notice of the slate of candidates may also appear in the Club Newsletter to be mailed to each member in a timely fashion prior to the August meeting. Prior to the August elections, nominations from the floor will be in order. Election is by majority vote and the term of office shall be for one (1) year beginning at the next regularly scheduled meeting in September. No member shall hold more than one elected office.

Vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the President. If the Office of President becomes vacant, the Vice President shall serve the unexpired term.

5. "Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised", insofar as they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the special rules of order, as may be established from time to time, shall govern each meeting.

6. Committees shall be appointed by the President. However, a standing committee composed of the current Board of Directors shall prepare a Field Archery budget for the upcoming calendar year (January through December). The proposed Budget shall be submitted to the Cub Run membership for review and discussion at the September meeting, approval is not required. The President shall then submit the proposed budget to the Director of Field Archery for submission to the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, IWLA Board of Directors at their next Board meeting.

#### OPERATION

#### A. **PRESIDENT**:

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club. The President will represent the Club when attending meetings and other activities of allied organizations. The President shall receive up to seventy-five (\$75) dollars for expenses incurred when attending such events upon presentation of receipts and vouchers. The President shall coordinate and direct Club activities when participating in tournaments and other competitive events, file necessary reports and maintain records regarding such activities. Additionally, the President will approve and/or endorse reports and other matters submitted to the Chapter for audit.

1. The President may approve the expenditure of any member or members not to exceed \$250 between membership meetings only after the previous month's financial reports are accepted by the membership. Emergency expenditures in excess of the President's authorization may occur at any time with the approval of a minimum of two CRA officers or any CRA officer and the Director of Field Archery (CRA office shall be defined as the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer.)

#### B. VICE PRESIDENT

The Vice President shall serve as tournament chairman of all Club, as well as any local VBA and VFAA shoots. In addition, the Vice President shall assume the duties of the President in the absence of that officer.

#### C. SECRETARY

The Secretary shall keep minutes of all regular meetings of the Club, maintain a file of minutes, committee reports, records of any nature and up-to-date membership mailings and address list (including telephone numbers), a copy of which is to be kept in the archery field house. In addition, the Secretary shall maintain correspondence with VBA, VFAA, NFAA and other groups and individuals such as becomes necessary to support the efficient operation of the Club. Finally, unless this responsibility is designated to another individual, it is the responsibility of the Secretary to produce, edit, and mail the Club newsletter to each member on a timely basis to keep the membership informed of all pertinent matters.

#### D. TREASURER

The Treasurer shall serve without bond. The Treasurer shall be responsible for maintaining the financial records of the Club and submit a report at each meeting regarding the financial status of the Club. The Treasurer shall prepare a Treasurer's report, with the approval of the President, for submission to the Chapter, from time to time, for audit. The Treasurer shall maintain, in good order, a checking account at a convenient bank.

#### E. RANGE CAPTAIN

The Range Captain, after consultation with the President, shall form and supervise work parties, as needed, to maintain, repair, upgrade or modify the archery ranges so as to comply with the standards set by the VBA and address any issues of safety brought forward by Club members.

**F.** "Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised", insofar as they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the special rules of order, as may be established from time to time, shall govern each meeting.

**G.** Committees shall be appointed by the President. However, a standing committee composed of the current Board of Directors shall prepare a Field Archery budget for the upcoming calendar year (January through December). The proposed Budget shall be submitted to the Cub Run membership for review and discussion at the September meeting, approval is not required. The President shall then submit the proposed budget to the Director of Field Archery for submission to the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, IWLA Board of Directors at their next Board meeting.

#### H. RANGE CAPTAIN

The Range Captain, after consultation with the President, shall form and supervise work parties, as needed, to maintain, repair, upgrade or modify the archery ranges so as to comply with the standards set by the VBA and address any issues of safety brought forward by Club members.

## **RANGE RULES**

- **1. APPLICATION:** All members and guests shall abide by the safety rules set forth by the IWLA Cub Run Archers when in the archery areas.
- **2. SIGN IN:** All IWLA members and guests must sign in and out of the log book and display their range safety badges when using the range facilities. Guests must sign a Guest Release form prior to using the range facilities.
- **3. RANGE QUALIFICATIONS:** Anyone shooting on the archery ranges must be under the direct supervision of a range qualified member. Range qualifications shall consist of a visibly seen safety badge issued by the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, IWLA.

#### 4. CLUB HOUSE KEYS:

A. Club house keys may be issued to any CRA member who actively participates in and supports the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, IWLA, Field Archery program. Participants shall include working in support of one or more of the following activities: (1) grounds maintenance; (2) range maintenance and repair; (3) building maintenance and repair; (4) working at tournaments and club shoots; (5) working as a regularly scheduled range officer (at least once a month) when the indoor range is scheduled to be open; (6) providing a scheduled, formal instruction program; (7) any other tasks designated by the CRA Executive Board.

- B. Club house keys may be issued to requesting members upon approval by either the CRA President or Vice President in conjunction with the Director of Indoor Archery and the member's signature on a key agreement form.
- C. Any key holder shall immediately return his/her key if he/she is (1) no longer a CRA member, for any reason; (2) is so requested by a majority vote at any regularly scheduled CRA meeting
- D. All key holders agree to act as Range Officers whenever at the Field Archery facility. The last key holder leaving the club house is responsible for closing and locking the facility.
- 5. CHILDREN: Children under the age of eighteen (18) must be in the company of a parent or guardian when in the archery facilities, except when shooting in a tournament.
- 6. **PETS:** All rules pertaining to pets will be the same as those of the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, IWLA. All dogs will be kept on a leash and are not allowed in any building, with the exception of those dogs which assist seeing impaired persons.
- 7. CHAPTER EQUIPMENT: All Cub Run Archers archery equipment may be used by any member in good standing. This includes bows, arrows, arrow straightener, bow press, arrow cutter, torch and all training videos. This equipment will not be removed from the Cub Run facilities without the permission of the Range Captain or

another member of the Board of Directors. All equipment must be used in a safe manner and should be used only after being properly educated on its usage.

- 8. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** No one shall handle or use another's archery equipment without the owner's permission.
- 9. GUESTS: The number of visits allowed per guest each year is defined in the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, Izaak Walton League of America bylaws; i.e., no more than three (3) visits per year for any guest living within a fifty (50) mile radius of the Chapter. Non-members of the Chapter will not be permitted to use any archery range unless accompanied by a Club member. Prior to shooting on any archery range, a guest must sign-in in the log book and complete the Guest Release statement. Arlington-Fairfax Chapter IWLA members are responsible for the conduct and actions of their guests.
- 10. ETIQUETTE: If more than four (4) archers are shooting, limit the number of arrows shot per group to four (4).
- **11. PROHIBITIONS:** Crossbows are permitted ONLY on the single crossbow lane so designated on the practice range. The rules posted on the shooting bench at this position must be strictly adhered to. Anyone observed shooting broad head-tipped arrows at other than targets expressly designed for that purpose will be referred to the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter Board of Directors for disciplinary action. Equipment deemed to be unsafe by the

Range Captain or a range qualified Cub Run member shall be removed from the vicinity of the archery ranges immediately upon request.

- **12. RANGE MODIFICATION:** Any range modifications, including the placement and use of temporary or permanent targets shall be at the direction and/or approval of the Range Captain. Unauthorized targets left on the ranges will be confiscated.
- 13. SAFETY RULES: a. Never load an arrow on the bow string until ready to shoot
  - b. Always keep a loaded bow pointed down range
  - c. Never walk the field range in reverse order; proceed from target to target in numerical order until the path returns to the exit from the range.
  - d. Always make sure that the target, shooting lanes and nearby areas are clear before drawing and shooting your bow.
  - e. Never retrieve arrows until all archers are finished shooting. At the target butts, never stand behind anyone who is pulling arrows
  - f. Always place the red/orange flag or your bow across the target face when looking for lost or pass-through arrows
  - g. Do not litter the archery ranges
  - h. All arrows found on the range shall be returned to the Archery fieldhouse for return to their owners
  - i. Never draw a bow with the arrow pointed above the horizontal position or straight up. Either situation can cause a serious accident.
  - j. Shoot only from designated marked distance stakes in front of each target. Never shoot from anywhere off the trails.
  - k. During tournaments or Club shoots, any more than six (6) or fewer than three (3) shooters in a group must be approved by the Range Captain or tournament Chairpersons.

**14. CLUB HOUSE AND INDOOR R ANGE:** The CRA club house and indoor range will be open whenever a Range Officer is in attendance.

**CHANGES:** The Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, Izaak Walton League of America, Cub Run Archers may add rules pertaining to the safety of the archery facilities, ranges and uses at any time. These rules are effective immediately and will be posted at the range facilities and published in the Newsletter.

## The Back Porch

England was once saved during the Battle of Crecy in 1346, thanks largely to longbowman, defending the country and themselves by killing as many as 2000 French knights and soldiers.

Back in the Middle Ages, a skilled long-bowman would be able to release up to 12 arrows in just 60 seconds, meaning they were able to fire an arrow at their target every five to six seconds!

In the Olympics, archery competitors are aiming to hit the 'gold ring'. To do that they need to have the ability to hit a target that's about the size of a beermat from nearly 230ft, which is the length of a Boeing 747 jet!

Five-time US Olympic archery champion Khatuna Lorig trained Jennifer Lawrence for The Hunger Games films. She's not the only Hollywood star to be adept with a bow. Thelma & Louise star Geena Davis just missed out on making the US Olympic archery team in 2000, placing 24th out of 300!

Originally, when women were initially allowed to participate in the Olympic Games, which was at the 1904 St. Louis Games, Archery was the only sport that women could take part in.

At present, the biggest gold medal haul for Olympic gold medals in Archery, with a grand total of 19, is South Korea.

In the olden days in Britain, a variety of sports have been banned by monarchs because the sports were said to be a 'distraction' from archery practice. These sports included football, bowls and, golf
