Jeff Del Vecchio was elected by the Board of Directors (BOD) of the Arlington Fairfax Chapter, IWLA at the March BOD meeting to the position of Director, Target Archery. Jeff will replace Robert D'Imperio who has resigned due to personal reasons. We welcome Jeff to this position and know he will do great things with the Target Archery program.

Archery camp – Bob Walla discussed the Archery Camp. The first Archery Camp will start Monday, March 14, and run for five weeks. The youth class will be held from 6:00 to 7:00pm followed by the adult class, from 7:30 to 8:30pm. The cost is \$80 per student. A second class is scheduled to start April 25. Dick Riemer responded that bows are ready, however a few arrows need nocks.

FITA Shoot -- FITA stands for French International Target Archery. Bob Walla mentioned that he wants to start them again. Jim Kerrigan is working on getting approved dates from USA Archery.

Junior Olympic Archery Development (JOAD) Program – Jeff Delvecchio needs volunteers to help with instruction.

VBA – Bob attended a phone meeting yesterday. The VBA is looking for a Hunter representative. Dave Dobbins commented on VBA discussions regarding changes in voting procedures.

Cub Run Archers Vice President – Dave Burke has moved to West Virginia. We are searching for a Vice President for the club. Dave Burke was also managing the money shoot.

Motion to cancel the June money shoot was unanimously approved.

Lani Young mentioned the Commonwealth Games at Liberty University will be July 22-24. More information is available at Commonwealthgames.org.

Mary Hicks explained that there is a combination of LED and fluorescent lights on the indoor range. Users are encouraged to let Mary know if any differences are apparent or preferred.

Work Party

Archery Range Work Party - 13 March 2022

In early February, we began preparations for the annual Archery Range Work Party. This is my third year planning this work party and looking at the calendar, we picked Saturday, March 12th as a good day to get things done. Growing up not far from Punxsutawney PA I should have known better than <u>not</u> listen to Punxsutawney Phil's spring forecast. Three days before the date, a snow storm with high winds was predicted, and sure enough we got close to 3" of snow with wind gusts up to 50 MPH. For the safety of the work crew, we cancelled Saturday and moved it to Sunday with a forecast of temperatures reaching in the mid to high forties.

The Saturday storm was not cooperating and decided to linger into Sunday with the cold temperatures. We had 25 volunteers scheduled for Saturday but when we rescheduled, that number

dropped to seven for Sunday. As I was driving to the club Sunday morning, the weatherman on the radio said the temperature was 18 degrees (at 7:30 AM) but with the wind chill it was equivalent to 12 degrees. And did I mention, this was the day we turned our clocks ahead for daylight savings time? My guess was that I would be the only one showing up this morning for this work party, but I was wrong.

A little after 8:30 folks started to roll in, right on time. After some quick introductions and a cup or two of hot coffee, the crew ventured out into the cold. We had planned 35 activities on the outdoor range and another 50 items on the 3-D course. With only 8 volunteers, we



narrowed our work efforts to just the outdoor range, and I was very pleased that this crew completed every item on that list that didn't include painting (it was just too cold to even consider paint).

Here is a sample of what was accomplished:

Build shelving unit in maintenance shed

Pull arrows, field-tips, and inserts from all the wood around the target butts

Build two new sign boards for the 3-D range

Cut the Grounding Rod out of the ground on left side of Maintenance Shed

Fix Orange fence on left side of outdoor range

Reverse the 10-point buck 3-D target

Replace "No Broadhead" sign on six of the target butts, people do miss the targets

Install new Big Shot Ironman targets at 20- and 30-yards butts (300 lbs each)

Move the old Big Shot Ironman targets from 20- and 30-yards butts to 50 and 60 butts

Flip the Big Shot Ironman target at the 40-yard butt

Restack and replace as needed, the bricks on the Rinehart Walls – seven different targets

Move the Pacific Bow Butt targets from 50 and 60 yard to the back of 15-yard butt

Take the 2x4' BLOCK targets to the dumpster, from 20-, 30- and 40-yard targets


Install 10 new bow holders on the 3-D range




Bear and Deer Harvest Data






Virginia Deer Harvest Summary

TO: THE VIRGINIA HOUSE OF DELEGATES

The Virginia Bowhunters Association wholeheartedly ENDORSES and SUPPORTS Senate Bill 8!

Virginia Bowhunters Association is one of the oldest hunting advocacy groups in the Commonwealth. We were instrumental in getting bowhunting approved by Virginia's Game Department in 1949. We believe our position represents Virginia's 95,000 bowhunters. We urge you to vote YES on SB 8 for these reasons:

- This legislation has already passed the Senate on a strong bipartisan vote (29-11). SB 8
 only allows Sunday hunting on public lands where hunting is already permitted, and would not
 open hunting on state parks, national parks, or other public lands where hunting is already
 prohibited. The legislation does not remove the prohibition against hunting deer or bear with
 the aid or assistance of dogs on Sunday.
- Sunday hunting is safe for all users and will increase equality of access to our public lands. There has been only ONE two-person hunting incident involving a non-hunter on public land in the last 10 years. Hunting is one of the safest recreational activities in America, ranking third behind only billiards and camping. You are 25 more times likely to be injured bicycle riding than hunting. (National Shooting Sports Foundation; VA DWR)
- The Board of the VA DWR supports Sunday hunting. The Board states that there is no
 game management reason for continuing a ban on Sunday hunting on public land. The Board's
 Resolution of October 2021 calls for ALL Virginia hunters and recreational enthusiasts to be
 treated equally and given full access to public land.
- Positive Economic Impact. SB 8 will create nearly 4,000 new jobs and increase the state economy by almost \$300 million. (Sunday Hunting Coalition; NSSF)
- Sunday hunting is widespread and successful. Currently 46 states allow hunting on Sunday
 to some extent. When Sunday hunting on private land was passed in Virginia, the "widespread
 conflicts" predicted by opponents did not materialize. Game populations have not been
 harmed. (Roanoke Times, VA DWR, Congressional Sportsmen's Foundation)
- Hunting is the only otherwise authorized recreational activity prohibited on public lands on Sunday in the Commonwealth. This is inconsistent with commonplace Sunday activities such as golfing, fishing, boating.

ELK HUNTING RETURNS TO VIRGINIA

Timeline For 2022 Elk Hunt

The hunt for the 2022–2023 season will be held Saturday, October 8, 2022 – Friday, October 14, 2022. There are five (5) antlered elk tags available for this year's hunt via lottery. Application period for the elk lottery will open February 1, 2022, and close March 30, 2022. Applications for a special elk hunting license can be obtained online, under elk hunting, or by calling the Department of Wildlife Resources Customer Service for assistance in applying via phone.

Applications require a non-refundable fee of \$15 for Virginia residents and \$20 for out-of-state residents. Winners of the elk hunting application will then need to purchase a special elk hunting license for \$40 for in-state residents, and \$400 for out-of-state residents. **The special elk hunting license is not transferrable to another individual.** Winners of the randomized computer drawing will be notified by May 30th. You can also check the status of your application by visiting your DWR <u>GoOutdoorsVA</u> page.

Once awarded a special elk hunting license, applicants will have 30 days from notification to purchase the license. Licenses that are not purchased by the deadline will be awarded to alternate hunters who will be drawn concurrently with the original hunters. Alternates will not be announced or notified unless they become eligible to purchase a special elk hunting license. Elk hunters 15 years of age and younger or holders of an apprentice hunting license must be accompanied by and directly supervised by an adult who has a valid Virginia hunting license or is exempt from purchasing a hunting license. All applicants who are drawn for a Virginia special elk hunting license must read and acknowledge the "Elk Hunting Considerations" prior to beginning their hunt.

DWR has many partnerships and agreements with private landowners in the Elk Management Zone that will allow public access for elk hunting.


