Notes From the July and August Meetings

Marv H raised the issue regarding the soda machine. After some tinkering with the machine it was determined the compressor is not cooling the machine. The machine is owned by Cub Run therefore we are responsible for the next steps. To replace it would be \$800 to \$1,000. Marv is going to have Keith P look at it to see if it is repairable and report back to the Cub Run Archers for further action.

Fred A reported on the new VA DWR regulation that it is now illegal to feed deer year-round due to the concern of CWD – page 45 of the 2021–2022 VIRGINIA HUNTING & TRAPPING REGULATIONS. As a result, a recommendation was made to no longer throw food scrapes out on the property. Not only for the deer concern, but also not to encourage skunks, raccoons, opossums, foxes and other creatures to come up to the clubhouse.

A discussion was raised about the Hunters for the Hungry. Cub Run Archers has not made any donations to this organization in 2020. Two motions were put forth – one for a \$100 donation to H4H and the other was to sponsor a golf hole at the annual golf tournament. A vote was taken and accepted to donation \$500 to sponsor a golf hole at the tournament.

Dave B. asked the in-coming secretary to investigate an additional method to accept payment for membership and new members. PayPal, Square, and Member-Planet were suggested.

A Cub Run Archers crab feast will be held on 12 Sept for Cub Run members and their guests. Cost is TBD, based on the going price for crabs but estimated to be \$35 per person. Details will be provided by Bob Walla for the minutes. Pre-pay would be required. A side dish is requested and BYOB.

VP mentioned a number of members would like to see a Buck Buster for Cub Run members and guests. Dave reported he will not be available in early September and asked for volunteers to run the shoot. Fred A stepped up to the task for a shoot on Saturday, 12 September from 9 to 11 AM. Details to be provided.

A meat saw has been hung behind the door in the Member side of the ORSS for deer processing.

Fairfax County Deer Mgt Program will install a freezer beside the ORSS for collection of deer heads taken by park hunters during the fall deer season. This has been approved by IWLA BoDs.

Range Information

Limited Broadhead Use on Outdoor Archery Range

The indoor and 3-D archery ranges are for <u>field tip use ONLY</u>. No broadheads are allowed on these ranges.

The outdoor archery range does provide broadhead targets but only on the target butts marked in bright red stating **BROADHEADS OK**

These target butts are located at the Cross Bow station and include 20, 30, and 40 yard Rinehart walls (4' x 4' black target butts).

There are also 2' x 2' Block target butts with **RED dots** that may be used for broadheads, and the **RED** cube dice at 50 yards.

In other words, if there is a **RED BROADHEADS OK sign or RED dots** on the Bock target butts, these may be used for broadheads.

<u>All other targets are for field tips only</u>. This includes any 3-D targets that may be placed on the range.

And all core drilling broadheads are strickly prohibitted on the IWLA archery range.

Anyone witnessing broadhead usage on these targets, please notify the Archery Range officer or any Cub Run officer.

As stated on the IWLA/Cub Run Archers <u>website range rules</u> (Section 11 PROHIBI-TIONS): "Anyone observed . . . shooting broad head-tipped arrows at other than targets expressly designed for that purpose will be referred to the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter, IWLA Board of Directors for disciplinary action."

COVID-19 information (UPDATE: June 21, 2021):

- Virginia Governor Northam Update as of June 21, 2021

The state of emergency that Governor Northam declared on March 12, 2020 in response to COVID-19 expired on June 30.

Unvaccinated individuals and those who are not fully vaccinated should continue wearing a mask, practicing physical distancing, and avoiding crowds and poorly ventilated spaces in accordance with federal CDC guidance.

- As of May 14, 2021 - EO-79 (Effective date May 28th).

(EO-79 terminates 7th Amended Number EO-72(2021) as of May 28th)

Chapter Policy on Chronic Wasting Disease

Chapter Policy on Chronic Wasting Disease

- Following Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources (DWR) regulations, any deer harvested in a Virginia Damage Management Area (DMA) or harvested in any surrounding state shall not be allowed on Chapter property for skinning and/or processing.
- Following DWR regulations, no member shall dispose of food scraps on any Chapter property. *All scraps should be placed in a trash bag and disposed of.* This is not only a Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) concern, but also to not encourage skunks, raccoons, opossums, foxes, and other creatures to come near the clubhouses.
- Fairfax County Deer Management Program (DMP) will be collecting deer heads harvested in Fairfax County parks for CWD testing from October through November. DMP will place a cooler/freezer along the side of the archery shed for collection of these deer heads. Chapter members who are participating in DMP will be able to drop off their deer heads at this location. Chapter members may also escort non-Chapter members in the DMP to drop off their deer heads at this location. Instructions will be available in the cooler/freezer.


CWD Regulations in Virginia

CWD is a major concern for DWR. CWD was discovered in 2020 on the western edge of Loudoun County and resulted in the creation of a new Damage Management Area (DMA–2).

DWR has since created a third DMA in the southwest region of the state. This is all spelled out in the 2021–2022 VIRGINIA HUNTING & TRAPPING REGULATIONS.

Two points of particular importance to us here in Fairfax County are:

• Whole deer carcasses originating from within a DMA cannot be transported into a non-DMA county. For Chapter members, it is illegal to bring any deer taken from a DMA to the Chapter for skinning and/or processing. Deer harvested in Fairfax, Prince William, or Stafford Counties are okay to process at the skinning station. Any deer from Loudoun, Fauquier, Culpeper, other counties west, or from any other state, may not be brought on Chapter property.

Chapter Policy on Chronic Wasting Disease

It is now illegal to feed deer at any time of the year in many counties of Virginia including Fairfax.

It's difficult to find this regulation, but it is in the 2021–2022 VIRGINIA HUNTING & TRAPPING REGULATIONS on page 45 and states: "Deer Feeding Prohibitions: Feeding of deer is prohibited year-round in Albemarle, Bland, Buchanan, Carroll, Clarke, Craig, Culpeper, Dickenson, **Fairfax**, Fauquier, Floyd, Franklin, Frederick, Giles, Greene, Loudoun, Louisa, Madison, Montgomery, Orange, Page, Patrick, Prince William, Pulaski, Rappahannock, Roanoke, Rockingham, Shenandoah, Spotsylvania, Stafford, Warren, Wise, and Wythe Counties, and all cities and towns within these counties." Based on this new regulation,

Cub Run Archers highly recommends we no longer throw food scraps out on the property. Not only for the deer concern, but also to not encourage skunks, raccoons, opossums, foxes, and other creatures to come up to the clubhouse.


