

Upcoming Events:

April Meeting 7 April, 11:00 AM



President: Bob Walla proposes two changes to the bylaws. They are posted on the board for review and will be voted on at the next meeting on April 7th.

Tournament Director/Vice President: The key policy will remain unchanged. RO requirements no longer include level 1 training. March 24 is the Winter Classic 9-11 registration. We will once again participate in inter club competition with other local archery clubs this year.

AFC Archery Director: 21 people for the last 101 class. Next weekend will be STAR Fita indoors. March 30th Park qualifications begin. The new fee is \$10 per attempt.

Correspondence/Secretary Report: For those members that have not paid their dues, this will be the last newsletter.

Range Captain: Fred Ansick has presented the 2019 budget. Two new Rhinehart walls are on order. Work party on the 16th finished extending the safety fence. Several targets and stakes were moved to improve safety. We are ordering another set of ASA targets. Cub Run will pay for the acquisition costs while IWLA will cover the purchase cost.

Membership Concerns: Competition team members did well at Indoor Nationals. If IWLA members would like to stay and shoot after Range Officer duty hours are scheduled to end, they are entitled to stay but must lock up when leaving.

Indoor Archery Director: 233 members used the range this month.

3D Director: Ryan will make a judgment call on which 3D targets need replacing for the upcoming Winter Classic.

VBA Representative: Red Bourdage report that VBA wants to reduce from four meetings per year to two.

New Business: Fred would like to put up another plywood safety board by 13. Also a double snow fence on trail up to 15.

Old Business: Thanks to everyone that helped with the swap meet. A special thanks to Steve Johnson for his wonderful job organizing the event. \$830 profit for Cub Run Archers.

Youth and Apprentice Spring Turkey Hunting Weekend Season Dates

April 6 and 7

- Statewide.
- Bag limit is one turkey (bearded bird only) per youth/apprentice hunter, per weekend.
- Resident and nonresident youth hunters 15 years of age and under or holders of a valid apprentice hunting license, when in compliance with all applicable laws and licenses, may hunt when accompanied and directly supervised by an adult over the age of 18 who has a valid Virginia hunting license or is exempt from purchasing a hunting license. Nonresident youth of any age need to have the appropriate licenses (unless exempt from purchasing a license).
- Hunting hours are from 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset.
- Turkeys harvested by youth or apprentice hunters count against their daily and season bag limit.
 - Adult hunters accompanying youth or apprentice turkey hunters:
 - do not need a deer/turkey license on this weekend.
 - o may assist with calling.
 - o shall not carry or discharge a weapon.
 - shall maintain close visual and verbal contact with, provide adequate direction to, and can immediately assume control of the firearm.

Spring Turkey Season

Bag Limit

One per day, bearded turkeys only. Hunters may take one, two, or three bearded turkeys depending on how many turkeys were taken in the fall season.

Season Dates

April 13 through May 5

- One-half hour before sunrise until 12 noon each day.
- Statewide
- One-half hour before sunrise until 12 noon each day.

May 6 through 18

- Statewide
- One-half hour before sunrise to sunset.

Legal Methods and Restrictions for Spring Firearms and Youth and Apprentice Spring Turkey Hunting Weekend

Special restrictions apply to specific firearms use during these seasons. See <u>Legal Use of Firearms and Archery Tackle</u> and <u>Local</u> Firearms Ordinances for details.

- Arrowguns are allowed.
- Modern firearms.
- Archery tackle.
- Muzzleloading firearms.
- Decoys and blinds may be used.
- It is unlawful to use electronic calls.
- It is unlawful to use dogs, except that dogs may be used to track wounded or dead turkeys.

When using a shotgun it is unlawful to use or have in possession any shot larger than number 2 fine shot during spring turkey season.

We are presenting a combined Level 1 – Level 2 USA Archery Instructor Certification Course in Keezletown on 12-13 April. It may be a good opportunity for some VBA members to attend. Archers attending one day may be certified as Level 1 and those attending both days may be certified as Level 2.

The course has been commissioned by Brethren Woods Camp and will be held at their location, 4896 Armentrout Path, Keezletown, VA 22832. Time will be from 9:00 am to 5:30 pm each day. Cost for VBA members will be the cost of the materials: \$35.00 + S&H for Level 1 or \$40.00 + S&H for Level 2 for materials and a share of actual instructor travel costs. Lunch will be provided each day.

There are written tests required for both the Level 1 and Level 2 certifications; however, much of the material will either be familiar or fit with prior knowledge for experienced archers.

Materials must be ordered on 1 April to arrive on time for the course, so advance enrollment is required. At this time there are 8 slots available.

These Instructor certifications are accepted by USA Archery, NFAA and ASA.

Instructors are Jerry Wenzel, NFAA Master Coach and USA Archery Level 4-NTS Coach and Mary Wenzel, NFAA Master Coach and USA Archery Level 3-NTS Coach.
