

Pilot Deer Management Program – Phase II

Prince William County Department of Parks, Recreation and Tourism *Chief Park Rangers Office* October 4, 2018

SYNOPSIS

The Prince William County Department of Parks, Recreation & Tourism is taking the lead role for administering *Pilot* – Archery Deer Management Program for the second year in a row. Phase – II of the Pilot Deer Management Program is scheduled to begin on Saturday, October 6, 2018 and conclude on Thursday, February 28, 2019. As in Phase I, only the (3) Three Hunt Groups that were approved in accordance to the County's RFI/RFP Process in 2017, will take part in Phase – II. All Hunters are members of the authorized Hunt Groups.

The Hunt Groups for the Pilot Archery Deer Management Program are as follows:

- Deer Management Specialties
- Stafford Archers
- o Suburban White Tail Management

Approximately (84) Eighty – Four Hunters will be involved in Phase – II during the 2018-2019 Program. This is an **ARCHERY PROGRAM ONLY**; <u>absolutely</u> *No Firearms* are permitted in this Pilot Program.

Dates for Pilot – Archery Deer Management Program Hunts

- o October 6th thru November 16th
- o Break (*No Hunting*) November 17th through December 1st
- o December 2nd thru February 28th

Highlights for Phase II – Pilot

- o Additional Properties (sites) were added to the Pilot Program
- o Five Days a week, per site, are authorized for the Managed Hunts
- Extended Hunting Period to align with the County's entry into the Urban Archery Season
- o Informational Signage will be posted at all sites during the Hunts

Concluding Comments

Hunting is conducted by elevated tree stands only. The optimal shot to be taken by Hunters is 13 Yards vertically down with 12 Yards horizontal distance. The ground serves as a backstop for the arrow. Tree stands must not be located closer than 100 feet from a visible property line or closer than 50 feet from a park trail. While adjacent to off-limit County property, archers may place their stands up to a 100 foot buffer the edge of the park boundary as long as they face the approved park. No shots are to be taken where the arrow or bolt will impact outside of the Park property line. Ground blinds may not be used in any park within the Prince William County Pilot Archery Program.

All Hunters participating in this Pilot MUST be a member of the above hunting groups and MUST have their *Virginia Hunting License*, *Virginia Big Game License*, and *Virginia Archery License*. Hunters harvesting deer under this program will be utilizing DPOP Tags unless they are utilizing an individual tag for an antlered deer in accordance to DGIF regulations.

The Chief Park Rangers Office is overseeing the Pilot Archery Deer Management Program in conjunction with Mr. Brendon Hanafin, Pubic Works – Historic Preservation. All questions, concerns and comments should be forwarded to the Chief Park and/or Mr. Hanafin.

VBA Club Presidents/Delegates: From VBA President

The Order of the Golden Feather recommended to the VBA Delegates they create a new award called the Silver Arrow Award. After discussion at Sunday's Quarterly Meeting, the Delegates approved a motion to adopt the proposed wording shown below for the Silver Arrow Award to be integrated into the VBA By-Laws as a new Article. Per the Delegates direction, I am forwarding to you the proposed language, so your club can review and discuss. Please do so, and have your Delegate prepared to vote the desires of your Club at the January Quarterly Meeting.

FYI, I have received four nominations from clubs to date. I am holding these pending approvals of the proposed change to the VBA By-Laws. If approved at the January Quarterly meeting, these nominations will be presented to the Delegates for their review and approval, along with any new nominations that are received. Approved Silver Arrow Awardees will be recognized at the VBA Annual Awards Banquet.

Proposed wording to add the Silver Arrow Award to the VBA By-Laws is as follows:

Article 17. THE SILVER ARROW AWARD

Section 17.1. Preamble



The VBA will create an order to be known as the "Silver Arrow Award." The purpose of this award is to honor those persons who have demonstrated 5 or more years of sustained service and excellence to the sport of Archery and/or Bowhunting within the Commonwealth of Virginia. There is no requirement to have demonstrated service at a State or National level, nor is there any requirement to have served in an elected or appointed position within the VBA. The focus is on service and support at the VBA Regional level. Therefore, the nomination should demonstrate an impact on multiple affiliated clubs and or Archery/Bowhunting programs. This award will be bestowed in honorary recognition with no specific duties or authority, no additional VBA authority and no new VBA organization/element should be created.

Section 17.2. Rules

A. Candidates may be submitted to the VBA Directors by an affiliated club at any official meeting. At that time, the nominee's qualifications will be read.

B. Approval of the Silver Arrow Award will be by an approval vote of 75% of the VBA Delegates present at the meeting. Each affiliate club shall have only one vote for the purposes of approving the Silver Arrow Award.

C. In recognition of the Silver Arrow Award, each awardee will be presented with a suitable lapel pin in the shape of a silver arrow, a patch and a certificate. Awardees shall also be recognized in the Flight, on the VBA Web page, and at the annual VBA Awards Banquet.



- D. Posthumous awards for deceased VBA members may be approved by the VBA Delegates provided the deceased VBA member met all of the required qualifications at the time of their passing. Posthumous awards will be returned to the nominating Club for presentation to the deceased VBA member's family or Next-of-Kin.
- E. A copy of each nominations and approval/disapproval action voted by the VBA Delegates will be recorded in the minutes of the meeting where the nomination was received.
- F. VBA members who belong to the Order of the Golden Feather are not eligible for award of the Silver Arrow Award. However, awardees of the Silver Arrow Award are eligible for nomination and induction to the Order of the Golden Feather, subject to the rules and procedures as stated in Article 16 of the VBA By-Laws.
